 DokuWiki is a standards compliant, simple to use  Wiki, mainly aimed at creating documentation of any kind. It is targeted at developer teams, workgroups and small companies. It has a simple but powerful  Syntax which makes sure the datafiles remain readable outside the Wiki, and eases the creation of structured text. All data is stored in plain text files – no database is required.
